The Phlebotomy Technician (CPT1) Program is a **5 week** curriculum on Saturdays and Sundays from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., **40+ hours** of externship, with **50 SUCCESSFUL** venipunctures and **10 finger sticks**.

Every student is expected to meet all course requirements before being eligible for completion and meeting the State's requirements. This Program is one of the requirements to begin your eligibility to apply for a State License.

REQUIREMENTS:

Students must bring their **ALL** the required documents before the first day of class. Evaluated Foreign Transcripts done by AACRAO or GED certificate at the time of registration or provide documents the **first Day of class**.

You also must provide proof of updated vaccinations.

COURSE OBJECTIVE:

The purpose of the Phlebotomy Technician (CPT1) Program is to provide the student with the appropriate educational theory and hands-on skills required and necessary to prepare them for entry-level positions as a Phlebotomy Technician (CPT1).

Phlebotomy, also known as venipuncture which consists in the process of drawing blood samples from people for research, diagnosis or blood transfusion. It is often done by trained professionals known as phlebotomists.

It is a highly rewarding career with prospects of around 15% growth over the next 7 years. People, who are interested in this field, need to join a phlebotomy class or training program before they can be certified and licensed.

JOB OUTLOOK

Employment of phlebotomists is projected to grow 27 percent from 2012 to 2022, much faster than the average for all occupations. Hospitals, diagnostic laboratories, blood donor centers, and other locations will need phlebotomists to perform blood work.

Blood analysis remains an essential function in medical laboratories and hospitals. Demand for phlebotomists will remain high as doctors and other healthcare professionals require blood work for analysis and diagnoses.

However, federal health legislation will expand the number of patients who have access to health insurance, increasing patient access to medical care. As hospitals and medical laboratories evaluate their staffing needs, phlebotomists may be replaced by other more skilled healthcare workers.
